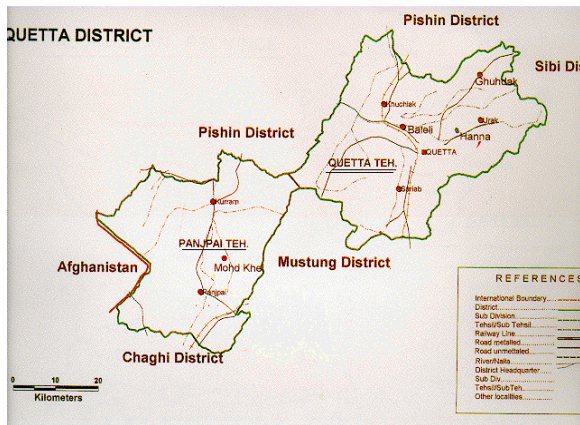


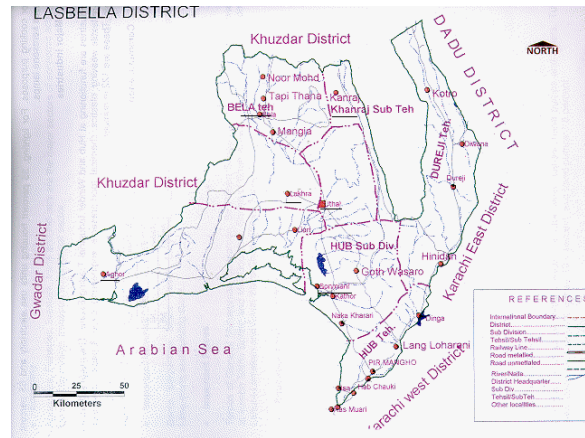

**Gender Justice Through Musalihat Anjuman Project
Annual Progress Report**

1.Introduction

Background of the Project:

In view of increased incidences of violence against women & other vulnerable groups and to provide quick, affordable and easy access to justice against violence through Alternate Dispute Resolution mechanism, the Ministry of LG&RD with the technical and financial (grant) assistance of UNDP and co-sponsorship of Norwegian Agency for Development (NORAD) has initiated a two years pilot project titled ‘Gender Justice through Musalihat Anjuman (GJTMA)’. In Balochistan the Project is under implementation in two districts of Quetta & Lasbella.

Goal of the Project:

To assist women and other vulnerable sections of society in improving their conditions through safeguarding and promoting their rights and lawful entitlements.

Long term objectives of the Project:

The long term objectives of the project is aimed at poverty alleviation by promoting gender equality and justice and assisting in achieving the Millennium Development Goal to Promote gender equality and empowerment of women.

The project’s short term key objectives are:-

- ❖ **Constitution and mobilization of the MAs in all UCs of the pilot districts;**
- ❖ **Capacity building of MAs through Provincial level network of Government and CSOs, etc i.e. Musalihat Anjuman Support**

After proper test and interview Mr. Pervaiz Jamali was recruited as Administrative Finance Assistant AFA, who joined office on June 1, 2005.

Mr. Habib- ur- Rehman was recruited as a driver after test and interview and he joined the office on 9th May, 2005.

With the induction of PPM, AFA and Driver the PMU Balochistan staffing was completed.

Activity 1.6

Procurement of office equipment/other hardware:

Office accommodation provided by the LG & RDD GoB in Room No 18, Block No: 9, Civil Secretariat, Quetta.

- Office accommodation was in dire need of renovation and furnishing. So accordingly the needful has been done.
- To have efficient and conducive working environment, communication and internet facilities provided to the office by installing two telephone lines 081-9203214, 9203215 and e-mail access through captjaved2001@yahoo.com.
- To make the Provincial Office fully operational procurements were

made by the federal unit for office equipments and other hardware.

By completion of above mentioned activities the GJTMAP Balochistan Office is fully operational.

Output 2

Constitution and mobilization of Musalihat Anjumans in all union councils in Pilot Districts.

Activity 2.2

Mapping of districts and subsequent selection of pilot districts in each province

Mapping of the districts were carried out for identifying two pilot districts in Balochistan as per prescribed criteria which is at **annex-1**. On the basis of mapping (surveys conducted and discussion) held Lasbella and Quetta were identified as pilot districts which were subsequently approved by PSC in its first meeting on 27th June 2005. Approval of pilot districts accorded is at **annex-11**.

Activity 2.3: “Preparation/Approval of Rules of Business for Musalihat Anjuman”(Preparation of model Rules of Business for the functioning of Musalihat Anjuman i.e. proper and comprehensive rules covering constitution and day to day working of these bodies).

The GJTMA project is achieving its desired objectives through realization of laid down parameters and implementation of activities as per the work plan.

The “Constitution and mobilization of the Musalihat Anjumans in all

Unions Councils in the pilot districts” would contribute towards Providing women victims of violence an alternate mechanism to obtain gender justice. This would be realized through implementation of the series of inter related activities as under:

One of these activities is **Preparation/Approval of Rules of Business for Musalihat Anjuman.**

A foremost requirement for transforming Musalihat Anjuman as a forum to address gender violence is the availability of proper and comprehensive rules covering constitution and day to day working of these bodies.

To deliberate in formulating comprehensive Rules of Business for MA ensuring maximum gender balance in the constitution and functioning of Musalihat Anjuman at the level of Union Councils, GJTMAP, Balochistan organized a series of workshops at provincial and pilot district **for framing recommendations about Model Rules of Business for MAs.**

Participants opinion thus formulated were :

- Educational qualification should not be mandatory.
- Word ‘*court*’ used in rule 2(b) should be replaced by ‘*court of law*’.
- Rule 3(2) should be deleted and the role of Union Council be limited to the extent of selection/election of Insaf Committee only.
- RULE (3)(4): For formation of Anjuman a meeting of residents may be held.
- ‘Make every effort’ appearing in Rule (3) (6) may be deleted so that one female member can be elected.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>'Has legal/Judicial experience'</i> (the words used in last Line of rule 3(6) should be deleted.• The term of Musalihat-e-Anjuman shall be till next selection of Musalihat-e-Anjuman.• After the last word of Rule 3(7) words 'after hearing and being satisfied if found guilty' be added.• The participants recommended that the members of the MA should be 5 comprising, of 3 Male and 2 female members• During resolution of Family disputes the parents of both parties should also be involved.• To monitor the activities of MAs there should be monitoring committee at Tehsil or District level.• Rule # 8, section 342 CRPC be corrected and rewritten as section 345.• There should not be any remuneration for MA members. Cases should be resolved on voluntary basis by MA members.• No party should have the right to drag the arbitrator in any court.• The copy of decision made by MA should be submitted to respective Police station and Court.• The MA members should make their decision independently without coming under any pressure or influence.
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- There should be some budget for MA to record the cases and for their office expenses.
- The training should be arranged for the capacity building of MA members.
- Public assemblies should be arranged in different union councils for Mass awareness of MA functions.

Resultant input from all the stake holders at provincial level has facilitated in formulation recommendations for Rules of Business for functioning of MAs in the socio-cultural context of Balochistan.

Sub Activity 2.4.1

Meeting of Provincial Steering Committee:

After obtaining nominations of representatives from concerned departments/organizations, PSC was notified on June 20th, 2005, which is at **Annex 111**. The GJTMAP Balochistan took the lead by holding the first meeting of PSC in the project history on June 27th, 2005 in the Library of P&D D, GoB under Secretary LG &RD D, GoB (Chairman PSC). The recommendations of PSC meeting are at **annex- 1V**.

Activity 2.4 Formation of Musalihat Anjuman in all pilot districts

Sub Activity 2.4.2 Strengthen MAs and enhance visibility of MA's through the District Governments and LG&RD Departments:

The GJTMA project is achieving the desired objectives through realization of laid down outputs and implementation of activities as per work plan.

Constitution and mobilization of the Musalihat Anjumans in all Unions Councils in the pilot districts would pave way towards providing women victims of violence an alternate mechanism to obtain gender justice. This would be implemented through a series of inter related activities.

Strengthen MAs and enhancing visibility of MA's through the District Governments and LG&RD Departments:

To Strengthen MA and enhancing its efficacy District Government and LG &RDD GoB have to be actively involved, being implementing partner to inculcate feeling of ownness about the project. To achieve the objective the political representatives have been taken on board at the Provincial and district Level by involving them in all briefings, workshops and meetings and their suggestions for strengthening MAs and enhancing their credibility once they are practically functional obtained.

As an output bureaucracy and Community based NGO mobilized and their valuable inputs for strengthening of MAs ascertained.

Orientation Session for District, Tehsil & Union Nazims, Secretaries and Female Councilors of Pilot Districts:

To strengthen MA and enhancing its viability as an awareness raising measure two Orientation Sessions of District, Tehsil & Union Nazims, Secretaries and Female Councilors of Quetta & Lasbella were conducted on Nov 23 and Dec 17, 2005 respectively at Quetta and Lasbella.

The session resulted in early formation of Insaf Committees and MAs at both the districts.

Participation in UNI CEF and IDO Workshop on Dec17,2005 :

IDO with support of UNICEF organized a training workshop for TMOs of Balochistan at Serena Hotel. The Provincial PMU availed the opportunity by briefing the officers of Tehsil Governments about the Project which has paved way for early formation of Insaf committees and MAs with the support of TMOs.

Note: By the grace of Almighty Allah 49 Insaf Committees / 49 MAs and 18 Insaf Committees / 18 MAs have so far been formed in Quetta & Lasbella respectively.

Output 3: “Capacity Built to Dispense Gender Justice at the Community Level”.

Activity 3.1

ADR Understanding and Formation of MASS:

Provincial level network known as MASS (Musalihat Anjuman Support Services) had to be established in each of the province by formalizing a consortium of NGOs having demonstrable track record in legal rights awareness and social mobilization.

MASS had to be established jointly by the Departments of LG&RD

and Social Welfare and Women Development in Balochistan.

Balochistan again took the lead by organizing three workshops at provincial and district level on the ADR understanding and formation of MASS with the following Objectives:

- Awareness raising about the GJTMA and consultation with partners
- Consultation on formulation of MASS
- Identification of partners, R&R's and resources at Provincial, District and UC levels.

The following recommendations emanated from the workshops:

- PSC be responsible for the formation of MASS.
- Identification of Scope of work for working of MAs particularly cognizance of cases of Abuse, violence, bullying & other women petty issues.
- Capacity building of Union Council Members.
- MASS representative should be on the forum in the next meeting of PSC as decided in its meeting on 27th June, 2005, to complete the composition of PSC.
- The workshop participants like wise recommended representation of Law department in MASS.
- Participants lauded efforts of UNDP for an appropriate and timely initiative to assist women and other vulnerable sections of the society.
- Lesson learnt from a similar project launched by Tahreek NGO be taken as a guideline to implement the project in an effective manner.

- More women representation in MAs. On appraisal that Balochistan had already recommended for one out of the three members of MA to be female , even then recommendations were of minimum two female representatives (fifty fifty ratio) to emerge as more gender balanced body and secondly to eradicate hesitation/reluctance of being lonely in the forum.
- Appropriate financial support to the member of MASS, MAJA & PSC as well as resources for Capacity building recommended.
- Interaction amongst the provinces for a better insight.
- Launching of awareness campaigns in schools about gender violence by MAJA through blessing of Education Department.

Recommendations of the workshop enabled the PMU in MASS formation as well as sensitization of stakeholders.

Notification for the constitution of MASS was issued by LG&RDD GoB on July 29, 2005. (Annex ---V)

Activity 3.2. Capacity Building of MA through Mass

Sub Activity 3.2.2 Prepare and implement comprehensive training Programme for members of MA, for legal and procedural orientation to ensure uniformity and consistency in proceedings and decisions of MA.

The first Meeting of MASS was held on 3rd September, 2005.

Discussion were focused on the following issues:

- Promoting and spreading awareness about the justice services available from the platform of MA
- Promoting awareness about Alternate Dispute Resolution mechanism for curbing gender violence

- Promoting awareness amongst the women victims of violence about the MA for seeking justice
- Assisting the functioning of MA on gender violence issues through evidence, document collection, bringing witnesses to the proceedings and to liaise with local police for any support etc
- Providing follow up for the smooth implementation of the decisions/agreements reached as a result of MA proceedings
- Dissemination of legal awareness about the rights of women as well as other vulnerable sections of society at the district level (including schools and colleges)
- Monitoring and serving watchdogs over the proceedings of MA so that these are not allowed to impinge upon the rights of women or subject to elite capture.
- Establishing networks/communication channels with District level bodies including Criminal Justice Coordination Committees, Public Safety Commissions, Citizen Police Liaison Committees and Bar Associations for minimizing and curbing the menace of gender violence.
- To facilitate and support MA to provide legal aid, shelter, treatment etc. for the victims of gender violence as and when needed.

As a preview the modus operandi of the above mentioned issues was agreed. The understanding was also shared with Federal PMU and UNDP Country office in the pretext of the meeting at UNDP Office Islamabad.

The Second Meeting of MASS was held on October 24, 2005, in which a comprehensive training curriculum and the manner to impart training to members of MAs in a most appropriate manner were principally agreed. This has led to a better working understanding as well.

3.3 Sustainability of MA activities:

3.3.1 Periodic meetings “Between the members of MASS and Judiciary/police and administration in pilot districts for policy dialogue on enhancing the effectiveness of MA for curbing gender violence”

After Provincial level activities, attention was diverted on the main area of activities i.e. District level. In this context series of Periodic Meetings as per work plane were held in the year 2005.

Periodic meetings focused on policy dialogue on enhancing the effectiveness of MA for curbing gender violence between the members of MASS, Judiciary, Police and Administration.

Periodic meetings facilitated in streamlining a policy dialogue for enhancing effectiveness of MA and without any waste of time to ensure their efficacy once they were on board/functional.

Out put 4: Partnerships between judiciary, police and Musalihat Anjuman for accountable, fair and equitable dispensation of justice.”

Activity : 4.1 Constitution of MAJA

(MAJA network constituted in each of the pilot districts):

At the pilot district level (Quetta& Lasbella), a network of representatives of District Governments, NGOs, Bar and the academia known as MAJA (Musalihat Anjuman Justice Advocate) as decided by the PSC in its first meeting held on 27th June, 2005 was notified on Oct 19,2005. In the

formation of MAJA to ensure its formation as a representative body in each of the pilot district (in collaboration with the respective District Government) hard work was put in by MASS with the support / guidance of PSC.

Copies of the notifications of MAJA are enclosed as Annexure-V1&V11.

With the formation of MAJA performing of the following functions by the PMU became easier:

- Promoting and spreading awareness about the justice services available from the platform of MA
- Promoting awareness about Alternate Dispute Resolution mechanism for curbing gender violence
- Promoting awareness amongst the women victims of violence about the MA for seeking justice
- Assisting the functioning of MA on gender violence issues through evidence, document collection, bringing witnesses to the proceedings, liaison with local police for any support etc
- Providing follow up for the smooth implementation of the decisions/agreements pronounced as a result of MA proceedings
- Dissemination of legal awareness about the rights of women as well as other vulnerable sections of society from the district level (including schools and colleges)
- Monitoring and serving watchdogs over the proceedings of MA so that they do not impinge upon the rights of women or are subject to elite capture.
- Establishing networks/communication channels with District level bodies including Criminal Justice Coordination Committees, Public Safety Commissions, Citizen Police Liaison Committees and Bar

Associations for minimizing and curbing the menace of gender violence.

- To facilitate and support MA to provide legal aid, shelter, treatment etc. for the victims of gender violence as and when required.

Sub Activity: 4.3.4 Pilot District level workshops of elected members, Bar, Judiciary, Police and representatives of EDO (SW&WD) on women’s legal rights and ending violence in the light of MA experience :

Workshops will be held in all pilot districts involving lady councilors, elected members of provincial/district assemblies, judiciary, bar and provincial government representatives. These workshops shall prepare recommendations for involving men in curbing the menace of gender and domestic violence. The experience of Musalihat Anjuman to the extent of pilot districts shall also be incorporated in these workshops. The core objective of these workshops shall be to prepare district specific advocacy strategy for safeguarding women rights by enlisting support of male sections of the society.

There is no divergence of opinion that violence against women is the most serious social set back of this region. Women are gravely affected by various social and economic problems. Even in this modern era, women are facing various forms of discrimination and exploitation mainly due to the ignorance of their legal rights.

Based on the objective elaborated above a Pilot district level **workshops** were held at Quetta and Lasbella.

The workshops were chaired by Honourable Chief Secretary (C.S.) GoB and participated by Secretary LG&RDD, Secretary Law, Secretary Social Welfare and Women Development Deptt, GoB. Quetta workshop was also attended by NPM Women Political School (UNDP).

Participants put forward their recommendations which are as follows:

- At least two women should be made part of the Musalihat Anjuman, so that they could complement and supplement each others in high lighting and responding to the needs of violence, especially Violence against Women.
- Musalihat Anjumans must envisage their role as support mechanism for those in need, especially the women and children
- Musalihat Anjuman ensures enabling environment for women to protect their rights including their property rights and children bearing rights.
- Musalihat Anjuman should play pivotal role in sensitizing the male segments of the society for adopting reproductive health measures.
- Musalihat Anjuman should ensure the appropriate measures for women being part of the decision making.
- Musalihat Anjuman should play critical role in addressing the negative customary practices.
- Musalihat Anjuman members should be five with two women members.
- Financial support should be provided to Musalihat Anjuman for meeting their expenses.

The Chief Secretary expressed that his presence in the workshop was significant of provincial Government commitment about ownership of the project. He opined that the project had been initiated with a noble cause to address gender issues through MAs which in his view point was the appropriate forum before they converged into bigger ones. He showed keen interest for replication of the project in other districts. His support was maneuvered by the long lasting struggle of the project through hard work to mobilize / win support of the political / bureaucratic bosses of the province.

The C.S. appreciated the project achievements embarked in the context of women in Pakistan in general and Balochistan in Particular being a tribal society and wished for its success. The encouraging aspect of the workshop was the appreciation by the C.S. extending his all out support for the project. The key note address was concluded with the suggestion to hold similar workshops in the remotest areas of the pilot districts to make activities more participatory as it could serve as a better mean for achieving the objectives of the project and invigorating for appropriate functioning of MAs.

Another appreciable aspect of the workshop was active participation by elected representative of both the districts particularly presence of District Nazim Lasbella who traveled directly from Quetta to Hub to participate in the workshop. This in fact reflected the sheer hard work put in by the project staff to win support of district Government for effective implementation of the project.

As an output elected representatives, government functionaries and representatives of non governmental organizations were sensitized/ advocated about safeguarding women rights by enlisting support of male sections of the society as well as the presence of the worthy Chief Secretary GoB in the workshop of both the pilot districts gave a very

positive signal of support from the highest forum of the Province for the project.

Coordination/Support of other UNDP Gender Project:

In Balochistan the gender units are in constant contact and already coordinating with each other. Through extensive discussions working strategy has been devised. To cite an example in one of the informal meeting it was agreed that if women councilors, confronted with some cases with in their councils where Musalihat was required, WPS will refer it to GJTMAP Balochistan. In the same manner list of Lead Mentor & Research Analysts trained under W3P Project provided by WPS Project Balochistan.

The interactions were of an informal manner but in continuation of GSP workshop on June 28, 2005, these arrangements have been transformed in a formal manner.

Coordination meetings are to be held on rotational basis. In this regard the first meeting was held at GJTMAP, Balochistan on Aug 13, 2005.

It was agreed that coordination /support amongst the UNDP Gender Projects will be essentially utilized for attaining Project activities. Besides workshops organized by WPS for capacity building of newly elected women councilors at the district, town and community levels will serve as a Community Advocacy tool for achieving the designed objective.

In the similar manner Workshop /training sessions arranged by “Gender Mainstreaming through the Planning & Development Division & Departments Project for “Promoting advocacy for legislation will institutionalize the mechanism for systematic gender mainstreaming and

accountability in the government” will be used as a Community Advocacy tool.

Training Curriculum:

Through closer coordination MAs is included in the training curriculum of WPS Balochistan. This will lead to a better output and visible impact.

JUDICIAL SUPPORT (Chief Justice Balochistan High Court):

Meeting with Chief Justice Balochistan High Court was held on 22 /10/ 2005 for interaction about Gender Justice through Musalihat Anjuman Project (district Quetta & Lasbella) and to seek support of Judiciary at the apex level.

During briefing about the project the Honourable Chief Justice shared his views about ADR particularly about successful implementation in Singapore. For effective functioning of MA he further opined to include a member from judiciary for which the services of two judicial Magistrates exclusively for the task in the pilot districts could be deputed. Resultantly dispensing justice effectively at the grass root level having legal binding.

The project Unit considers the proposal as workable as this will also address one of the apprehensions expressed by consultant pertaining to politicization of decisions of MAs.

Comments on rules formulated by Justice (Retd) Nasira Iqbal were also shared. He opined for cognizance on all cases of civil nature by MAs.

Mr. Justice Kalashnath of Balochistan High Court was designated for the project guidance. Conclusively the Honourable Chief Justice extended all out support for the project and assured the PPD/PPM about his availability for any assistance/guidance and also consented to grace any occasion with

his presence undertaken as a project activity provided he was informed in time.

Lessons Learnt:

During the execution of the project the lesson learnt by Provincial PMU follows:

(i) Mass Campaign:

The PPMU tried its level best for awareness of the community, elected representatives of the pilot Districts/Province of Balochistan about extending Gender Justice through Musalihat Anjuman but a lot more is required for to be focused for effective implementation.

(ii) Apprehensions of elected representatives:

For Insaf Committees formation and MAs to function effectively the Union Nazims apprehend about influence from the influential of the area having stake in the local affairs. This has to be encountered through more mass awareness campaign both for the elected representatives and community including influential to educate make them aware about Musalihat and role of MAs and to address the apprehension of Nazmeen in effective manner as well as to minimize the role of Influential (Wadera, Sardar and khans) them for adoption of Alternate dispute Resolution methodology through Musalihat Anjumans as a preferable mode to address disputes amicably rather than to approach the Conventional court system for addressal. The project has already embarked for providing conducive environment for the effective functioning of MAs in the pilot districts. .

(iii) Mobilization of all stake holders:

To achieve the project objective all the stake holders i.e. Judiciary, Administration, Police and Local leadership has been taken on board. As a tool for effective and better mobility of the project through Orientation sessions.

(iv) Use of Influential in a positive manner:

For assigning a role to the influentials of pilot Districts for success of the project their inclusion in MASS to have an optimistic use of their influence in the area especially in the context of Balochistan being a tribal society is suggested.

(v) Determination:

Practical success of the project depend a lot of will power and determination to overcome the political, tribal and socio-cultural hindrances by seeking confidence and cooperation of the executers.
